
The Sea Turtle Protection Zone is defined as any area along ocean and inlet shorelines to a line six hundred feet (600') landward of Mean High Water and three (3) miles offshore of the Atlantic Ocean.

Jurisdiction

- Municipalities which have opted-out of the Palm Beach County Sea Turtle Protection Ordinance (approximately 30 miles of shoreline)

- Unincorporated areas under the jurisdiction of the Palm Beach County Sea Turtle Protection Ordinance (approximately 3 miles of shoreline)

- Municipalities under the jurisdiction of the Palm Beach County Sea Turtle Protection Ordinance (approximately 11 miles of shoreline including: Village of Tequesta, Jupiter Inlet Colony, Jupiter, Village of North Palm Beach, Riviera Beach, Palm Beach Shores, Lake Worth, Lantana, Boynton Beach and Manalapan)
